Library setup in a remote village, Deoria, Darbhanga, Bihar. The idea was to establish a library in a marginalized, underprivileged, and backward village. A place where everyone cannot afford a descent livelihood and good education. The initiative was taken by a young University graduate girl from the same village. The library consists of textbooks for underprivileged children and daily newspapers (Hindi & Urdu). In addition to that the initiative also help Students

Project Cost - Rs 7 Lakhs

Darul Amaan Welfare Society since its foundation has been continuously striving to make its dream come true. Society is well known in the Gaya region for its welfare works in the city, and for standing with the poor in the times of need. Society's work ranges from Education to Health Centre, Relief and Missionary Works.

In the April 2013, Society founded Madarsa Darul Amaan, and Darul Amaan Public Society. Around 240 students are registered in the school, and around 60 have already passed. The Abr Foundation granted fund to the organization for building expansion and establishment of computer Centre. The project has been successfully completed.

Project Cost - Rs. 47 Lakhs (Disbursed - 29 Lakhs)

The Foundation has committed to sponsor ten (10) students for this coaching for one batch. The coaching and other facilities shall be provided by R30 to these ten (10) students started from 1st December 2020 and completing on 30th November 2022.

Mission Taleem
